
What is the role of an ILO?

The role of an ILO is to serve as a channel of information between members of the public safety community, private sector, citizens and government entities, in the fight against all hazards crime and terrorism.

What makes a good ILO?

An ILO can be any peace officer, firefighter, state investigator, federal agent, military investigative or security services member, or anyone working closely within the public safety / homeland security community. The ILO must have good communication skills and a passion for learning about the threat of terrorism and ways to protect our communities. They educate others within their agency, thereby enhancing situational awareness, early warning, and operational preparedness. ILOs remain active and engaged with Ohio's Fusion Center Network.
